We have been called to make a difference in the lives of those with whom we share this beautiful world that is a reflection of the majesty of God.

There are several highlights that we will celebrate during the month of October. We will have a busy 2nd Sunday, as we celebrate with our Business and Professional Women's Ministry 24th Annual Four Seasons Tea. We will adjourn to the C. E. Kirby Multipurpose Center immediately following our morning Worship Service. On the 3rd Sunday, our Nurses Guild Ministry will celebrate their Annual Day Celebration. All services begin at 7:00 P.M. We will celebrate Men's Day on the 2nd Sunday in November. Men's Day Choir Rehearsal will begin on the 2nd Saturday of October. The calendar has a schedule of events and services that are planned to honor God, our church family, and the dedication of the many individual Christians who are committed to the Lord. Please refer to your newsletter and the calendar of activities and programs that I know that you will enjoy. Listed below is our yearly Plan of Giving that will occur on each of the four Annual Days. Again, our gifts will follow this format:

The total contributions based on this formula, which again, is beyond your normal tithes and offerings is only \$350.00 if you are a single person or if you are a husband and wife family, \$600.00. Additionally, this plan of giving will offer **\$35,000.00 + per year**, above our tithes and offerings, based upon the commitment of **100 members** of the Southern Star Family. If we pull together, not waiting for someone else to "do it", we will be able to complete many projects that are needed at our church. We can do this in Jesus' name, not just the present, but for years to come. Again, the success of this effort is twofold: one is obviously needed to finance some of the projects, which are needed at the church, and the second, and most important, is the spiritual component. We must bring all of the tithes and offerings to the storehouse so that there may be meat in My house (Malachi 3:10). Additionally, the success of this project is based on the entire church pulling in one, unified direction. I am convinced that the Lord will bless us for our efforts.

Chicken and Pasta Primavera

| 1½ cups uncooked bowtie pasta (or any other type of pasta) | 1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed cream of mushroom soup |
| ¾ cup milk | ¼ cup grated Parmesan cheese (optional) |
| ⅛ teaspoon ground black pepper | 2 cups broccoli florets |
| ⅛ teaspoon garlic powder | 2 carrots, sliced thinly |
| ⅓ can (about 10 ounces) canned chicken, drained | |

Cook pasta in boiling water. Drain. Meanwhile, prepare the cream sauce. In a medium saucepan, stir together soup, milk, Parmesan cheese, pepper, broccoli, garlic powder, and carrots. Reduce heat to low and cover. Simmer for 10 minutes, or until vegetables are tender. Stir occasionally. Stir pasta and chicken into cream sauce and heat thoroughly.





Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) **Subsidy Phase and Early Registrations**

Louisville Metro Office of Resilience and Community Services' LIHEAP Program is a federally funded program that provides financial assistance to help low-income residents pay utility bills. The Subsidy component of LIHEAP will begin November 4, 2019.

Pre-registration opportunities for the Subsidy Program will be offered during October for those residents who are on a fixed income, and who are elderly (age 60 or over) or disabled receiving social security, SSI, pension or Black Lung benefits.

Applicants must be Jefferson County residents within 130% of the federal poverty guidelines and willing to provide the documentation below.

Proof of all household income for the preceding month (Food Stamp award letter, Social Security Award letter, pay stubs, etc. or proof of \$0 income. Note: Zero Income forms are available at the Community Services office at 701 W. Ormsby Ave., Suite 201 or by [clicking here.](#))

Proof of Social Security Number or Permanent Residence card (Green Card) for each member of the household. Most current heating bill; or statement from your landlord if heating expenses are included in your rent; or statement from your utility company if you participate in a pre-pay electric program. Please bring the account number and name on the account for all heating fuel sources and electric.

Residents who meet the early registration requirements may apply for LIHEAP from Oct. 2 – Oct. 31. Appointments are required in advance utilizing the new, automated appointment system. This toll-free service will open on Wednesday, September 25 and will be available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.

The caller can follow the prompts to get the information needed and/or to schedule an appointment if available. The system provides a confirmation number indicating that an appointment was successfully scheduled.

Scheduling an appointment by phone, beginning September 25, 2019: Call 502-991-8391.

- Choose the desired location for your appointment (the six LIHEAP office locations are listed below.)
- Choose a date/time for your appointment
- Record your name – say and spell your first and last names slowly and clearly
- Enter a contact phone number
- Enter your 12-digit LGE account number (if applicable)
- Enter the last four digits of your Social Security number and date of birth
- Receive your appointment confirmation number (have pen/paper ready)
- Appointment details (location, date and time) will be repeated
- List of documents to bring to the appointment will be given

How to apply for LIHEAP Subsidy if you don't qualify for pre-registration?

Residents who don't meet the requirements for pre-registration - and who are income eligible - may still apply for LIHEAP Subsidy benefits starting November 4, 2019. Appointments must be made in advance beginning late October. Check back on this website mid-to-late October for more details.

A representative can help you apply.

Individuals who are unable to apply for this program in person may send a representative on their behalf. Simply provide the representative with a hand-written note, dated and signed from the applicant, giving them permission to handle their application for services. The representative will also need to provide the required documentation above that is required to apply for the services/programs.

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) – Crisis Phase

Louisville Metro Office of Resilience and Community Services' LIHEAP Crisis Program provides utility assistance to low-income residents who have received a disconnection notice from their utility service provider or a past due bill with a disconnection notice, or who have received an eviction notice from their landlord if utilities are included in their rent, or who are currently without utility services. This program will begin operation the first part of January 2020...check back later for more details.

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is funded by federal grants and is a pass through block grant from the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services.




SSMBC 2019 Annual Day Financial Update
