As we enter December, it is a time to reflect on how we have arrived at the end of the year because Southern Star has been blessed this year. We have witnessed several areas of growth. However, one of the greatest areas of growth that is happening at Southern Star is the growth of our collective spirituality. A church that is able to grow spiritually will also grow financially and numerically. Our greatest blessing is being able to be a blessing to others and we have certainly grown in this area. Additionally, let's continue to contribute towards the furnace project. We are doing well, however, we do not want the excitement to wane.

On the second Sunday at 5:00 P.M., we celebrate the Mass Choir's Annual Day, "An Evening of the Music of John P. Kee" as performed by the Southern Star Mass Choir. Please provide your support for the Mass Choir. Christmas will be celebrated on the Wednesday following the 4th Sunday; therefore, our normal monthly worship and meeting schedule may slightly change. Please notice these adjustments in the calendar. Additionally, we will celebrate Watch Night Service at 7:00 P.M. on the 31st. This will be the first time we have moved from the late-night meeting, however, because of safety issues, we will have our service at an earlier time.

The calendar has a schedule of events and services that are planned to honor God, our church family, and the dedication of the many individual Christians who are committed to the Lord. Please refer to your newsletter and the calendar of activities and programs that I know that you will enjoy. Listed below is our yearly Plan of Giving that will occur on each of the four Annual Days. Again, our gifts will follow this format:

The total contributions based on this formula, which again, is beyond your normal tithes and offerings is only \$350.00 if you are a single person or if you are a husband and wife family, \$600.00. Additionally, this plan of giving will offer \$35,000.00 + per year, above our tithes and offerings, based upon the commitment of 100 members of the Southern Star Family. If we pull together, not waiting for someone else to "do it", we will be able to complete many projects that are needed at our church. We can do this in Jesus' name, not just the present, but for years to come. Again, the success of this effort is twofold: one is obviously needed to finance some of the projects, which are needed at the church, and the second, and most important, is the spiritual component. We must bring all of the tithes and offerings to the storehouse so that there may be meat in My house (Malachi 3:10). Additionally, the success of this project is based on the entire church pulling in one, unified direction. I am convinced that the Lord will bless us for our efforts.

I wish to encourage you to trust God in these efforts. Remember, to be successful in this you must <u>Pray</u> for it, <u>Plan</u> for it, <u>Practice</u> it, and it will happen for you <u>Permanently</u>. Deep Dish Pizza

FOR THE PIZZA DOUGH

3/4 c. lukewarm water 1 tbsp. granulated sugar

1 packet (2 1/4 tsp.) active dry yeast

2 c. all-purpose flour 1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt

2 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil

FOR THE PIZZA

Cooking spray 2 tbsp. cornmeal

2 c. shredded mozzarella 1 (32-oz.) jar marinara

1 tsp. Italian seasoning

1/4 c. freshly grated Parmesan

- 1. Grease a large bowl with cooking spray and set aside. In a small bowl lukewarm water. Add sugar and stir to dissolve, then sprinkle over yeast and let sit until frothy, about 8 minutes.
- 2. In another large bowl, add flour, salt, and oil. Pour in yeast mixture, then mix with a wooden spoon until everything is combined and a shaggy dough begins to form. Knead against sides of bowl until dough starts to come together, then turn onto your work surface and knead, adding a pinch of flour if needed, until it feels elastic and only slightly tacky, 5 minutes.
- 3. Form into a tight ball, place into your oiled bowl, and cover with a clean dish towel. Let rise in a warm spot in your kitchen until doubled in size, about an hour and a half.
- 4. Preheat oven to 450° and grease a large skillet with cooking spray. Sprinkle cornmeal all over bottom of skillet.
- 5. On a lightly floured surface, gently flatten dough and roll with a rolling pin (or stretch with your hands) until about 12" in diameter. Press dough into prepared skillet and up the sides. Sprinkle cheese on top of crust, then cover with marinara and sprinkle with Italian seasoning and Parmesan.
- 6. Bake until crust is golden and sauce is bubbly, 20 minutes.

APPLYING THE SCRIPTURES

"Going Home a Different Way" Matthew 2; Luke 2



This narrative was written by me several years ago, and from time to time, I will go back and share it again, especially this time of year as we approach the observances of the birth of Christ.

Matthew's account tells of the Magi coming from the east after having seen a special star compelling them to follow it to where the King of the Jews had been born. They followed the star to the evil King Herod in Jerusalem and inquired of him as to where the Babe was. Herod, being jealous and feeling threatened, demanded that the priests and scribes tell him where the Babe was. They were told, Herod and the Magi, that the Babe was in Bethlehem as foretold by the prophets. Herod told the Magi to come back and tell him exactly where this new King was so he could go worship Him, also.

The Magi went to Bethlehem and found the Baby Jesus in the place where the star led them and presented Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. An angel appeared to them in a dream and warned them of Herod's evil plot to kill the Babe, so they returned to the east a different way.

Joseph, also being warned in a dream by an angel of impending danger, took the Baby Jesus and His mother, Mary, to Egypt instead of returning to Nazareth. They dwelt in Egypt until after the death of Herod.

In Luke's gospel account, we read of lowly shepherds tending their flocks by night and of their glorious encounter in the field with a host of heavenly angels proclaiming that a Savior had been born in Bethlehem bringing tidings of great joy to all people.

The shepherds were afraid and cautious, but compelled to go find this Savior for themselves. They found the Babe wrapped in swaddling clothes in a manger just as the angelic host had said. The shepherds became evangelistic and told everyone they met about the Christ Child. Their fear turned into praise as they returned to their flocks.

What is the lesson for us? Every time we assemble together to worship this same Savior, we should leave the assembly a little stronger in our belief and our praise a little purer. The way we go home geographically is not important.

Do I have to Share?

Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. Ephesians 4:32

Have you ever observed a chocolate fountain? Thick, gooey, liquid treasure bubbles up and overflows, trickling down, layer upon layer, spilling pools of chocolate into the basin below.

Have you wondered what it would be like to stand beneath the fountain, allowing the chocolaty liquid to cover you, opening your mouth to catch it and drinking to our heart's content?

As we imagine chocolate raining down on us, we can remember the undeserved, freely flowing grace that God poured down over us in Christ, even in the midst of our sin. "The grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus" (1 Timothy 1:14). God's abundant grace and forgiveness lavished on us overflows, spilling onto others too. They taste and smell and see God's grace through us.

Living a chocolate life, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we can share His rich, indulgent grace with others.

Wait a minute . . . Share? Do I have to *share*? Hearing that word in the same sentence as "chocolate" may make us a little queasy. Sharing may mean we get less than we want. And when it comes to chocolate, we want it all, don't we?

What a relief to learn that sharing grace is very different than sharing chocolate. Enabled by the Spirit as we share the same free-flowing favor God gives us in Christ, grace continues to pour down over us too.

Remembering that God has forgiven us so much more, we may ask if we should forgive even if someone doesn't deserve it. Are we willing to put someone else's needs first, though she acts selfishly? Do we have a spirit of giving, though he may give nothing in return? Do we serve to give others richer or sweeter lives, even if they brought bitterness to ours?

On our own, pouring out God's grace onto others would be impossible. But because His forgiving power is at work in us, we are able to be kind and tenderhearted, sharing His forgiveness and grace with everyone around us. It overflows to those who have betrayed us, mistreated us, or hurt us, even those who don't seek or deserve our forgiveness.

People experience the delicious taste of God's grace in Christ through us. When we share God's undeserved grace with them, we leave behind its sweet aroma and rich flavor. When they smell and see God's grace overflowing in us, they say, "Mmm. I'll have what she's having."

Lord, as Your grace overflows for me, empower me to share the same undeserved forgiveness and favor with the world around me. May others see Christ in me. In His name. Amen.



Eight choir members participated in the session, which consisted of the recording of four songs composed by Dr. Johnson for the R.H. Boyd Publishing Company in Nashville. Upon arrival at the studio, the kids gathered in a soundproof room, where they were suited with headphones and two strategically-placed microphones on the floor in front of them. With Dr. Johnson engineering behind the glass (in the control room) and Ms. Denille directing (in the room with the kids), the recording began! For each section of each song, the kids did a 'practice run,' then two or three more takes, until Dr. Johnson was satisfied with the results. It was an experience we will never forget! The finished CD will be used in the summer of 2020 by churches all over the United States and in the Bahamas, England, and Africa. There are *Super-Stars* in our midst – if you want an autograph, just ask!
