Ministry teams please submit your dates for the 2020 year. If you have not submitted your dates, please do so immediately. Remember, submissions of dates and the **churches or speakers**, have to be approved by the pastor and will be based on the needs of the church and then a first-come, first-served basis. We will attempt to scale back some of our dates this year, however, several churches that have not been able to worship with us will be on our new schedule. As you are aware, we will attempt to honor all submissions. Ministries submitting multiple dates will be considered; however, you will not be allowed to monopolize dates; it is our mission to allow <u>all</u> ministries to have an opportunity to serve.

As we move into 2020, there is an immediate need to increase our giving. Several of our dedicated members have been called to be with the Lord, and this have left a financial void. Those who remain on the battlefield are obligated to fill this void by giving as the Lord requires. If all of our members would simply honor God in our tithes and offerings in the manner that we are biblically required, we would please heaven and find blessings through the worship of giving. We must strive to meet the Biblical standards of where our church should be. Far too many of the membership are relying on others to support the church. This is not only against the commandments of the Lord, but totally unfair. When the Contribution Statements of Giving are received, (which will be distributed on the third and fourth Sundays of this month), look at your contributions, look into your heart, and ask the Lord, if He is pleased with your efforts. We have several projects which must be addressed, and the overall maintenance of the church must be maintained. We must all do our part to follow the Lord's command in matters of our giving. Please note that if you are an officer, your giving must reflect your position. We will celebrate "All Tithes Sunday" on the first Sunday in February.

John 3:16 speaks of the love of God that created a special gift from Him to the world, a gift that was incorruptible and a gift that was everlasting. Jesus continues to be the greatest gift that we have received. I pray that we at Southern Star forever love, cherish, and honor the gift by reflecting the attributes of the special gift given by the Lord. The calendar has a schedule of events and services that are planned to honor God, our church family, and the dedication of the many individual Christians who are committed to the Lord. Please refer to your newsletter and the calendar of activities and programs that I know that you will enjoy. Listed below is our yearly Plan of Giving that will occur on each of the four Annual Days. Again, our gifts will follow this format:

The total contributions based on this formula, which again, is beyond your normal tithes and offerings is only \$350.00 if you are a single person or if you are a husband and wife family, \$600.00. Additionally, this plan of giving will offer \$35,000.00 + per year, above our tithes and offerings, based upon the commitment of 100 members of the Southern Star Family. If we pull together, not waiting for someone else to "do it", we will be able to complete many projects that are needed at our church. We can do this in Jesus' name, not just the present, but for years to come. Again, the success of this effort is twofold: one is obviously needed to finance some of the projects, which are needed at the church, and the second, and most important, is the spiritual component. We must bring all of the tithes and offerings to the storehouse so that there may be meat in My house (Malachi 3:10). Additionally, the success of this project is based on the entire church pulling in one, unified direction. I am convinced that the Lord will bless us for our efforts.

I wish to encourage you to trust God in these efforts. Remember, to be successful in this you must <u>Pray</u> for it, <u>Plan</u> for it, <u>Practice</u> it, and it will happen for you <u>Permanently</u>. Continue to keep the church and her members in your daily prayers. We know that God hears and answers prayers. We must never forget that "God is good all the time and all the time, God is good!" For <u>such a time as this</u>, we have been chosen as instruments of God's plan for the procurement and elevation of this church and community. I ask that you join me as we move into <u>such a time as this</u> at the Southern Star Missionary Baptist Church.

The Star Café Recipe of the Month

Carrot and Pineapple Cake

Cake Ingredients:

2 cups granulated sugar	1 1/3 cups vegetable oil	3 extra-large eggs, at room temperature	
1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract	2 1/2 cups plus 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour, divided	2 teaspoons ground cinnamon	
2 teaspoons baking soda	1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt	1 cup raisins	
1 cup chopped walnuts	1 pound carrots, grated	1/2 cup diced fresh pineapple	
2/3 cup buttermilk	1 cup chopped pecans	confectioners' sugar	

Frosting Ingredients:

3/4 pound cream cheese, at	1/2 pound unsalted butter, at room	1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract	1 pound confectioners'
room temperature	temperature		sugar, sifted

For the decoration: 1/2 cup diced fresh pineapple

Preparation:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Butter 2 (8-inch) round cake pans. Line with parchment paper, then butter and flour the pans. *For the cake:* Beat the sugar, oil, and eggs together in the bowl of an electric mixer fitted with the paddle attachment until light yellow. Add the vanilla. In another bowl, sift together 2 1/2 cups flour, the cinnamon, baking soda, and salt. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients. Toss the raisins and walnuts with 1 tablespoon of flour. Fold in the carrots and pineapple. Add to the batter and mix well. Divide the batter equally between the 2 pans. Bake for 55 to 60 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out clean. Allow the cakes to cool completely in the pans set over a wire rack.

For the frosting: Mix the cream cheese, butter and vanilla in the bowl of an electric mixer fitted with the paddle attachment until just combined. Add the sugar and mix until smooth. Place 1 layer, flat-side up, on a flat plate or cake pedestal. With a knife or offset spatula, spread the top with frosting. Place the second layer on top, rounded side up, and spread the frosting evenly on the top and sides of the cake. Decorate with diced pineapple.

Shall we walk again and remember him, not as the Madison Avenuers do, but in solitude and hope with acts of courage and compassion, carving fresh paths of righteousness?



APLYNG THE SCRIPTURES

I was granted the honor of expounding on the Sunday school lesson regarding acceptable offerings. The listed scriptures were some of the references used by me to enhance the point of what is acceptable to God as gifts from us. These scriptures are the account of the offerings of Cain and Abel.

Abel's offering was accepted; Cain's was not. Abel, being a shepherd, offered the firstlings and best of the flock. It is suggested that Cain, a tiller of the soil, gave an offering without much forethought. When God confronted Cain, He found him in a bad mood and dejected.

All of the mentioned scriptures imply different reasons why Cain's offering was rejected. Theologians still don't know for sure. God told Cain "If thou doest well thou will be accepted."

How does one "do well?" We know that God required obedience and time with Him from Adam and Eve. The Israelites offered animals and grains. 


